Five into Four

The craft theorist David Pye once observed that craft was a word with which to start an argument. Making a distinction between art and craft is a contentious business. Art lovers tend to look down their elevated snouts at what they see as the homely and lesser world of craft. In the end, it's all about the visual encounter. Art, craft or dross — you decide. This show, (five artists in four rooms — hence the title) curated by Frances McDonald, features work by five of Ireland's leading craft workers. You will find it hard to find an object in any Dublin

gallery more exquisite than Cólín O Dubhghaill's gold alloy and copper bowl, pictured. Admire also the calm decorous beauty of Frances Lambe's ceramic ovals with their intricate patterns. Simple vessels predominate but Nuala O'Donovan's abstract work offers some visual complexity. Liam Flynn demonstrates that ash can be used for more than hurleys, while Sara Flynn's porcelain pieces radiate a quiet elegance.
